Components of an EPSRC Standard Grant

Case For Support	/ "hard" bit. Tra (6 pages max	meat of the proposal. Generally the very ack record (2 Pages). Decsription of work (2).
Justification for Resources	Why you need hard. 2 pages	I what you asked for. Shouldn't be that max.
Pathways to Impact	What you are world cares at	going to do to make sure the wider bout yoru results. 2 pages max. Hard.
Schedule (e.g. Gannt chart)	 Fairly straightf 	Forward.
Staff CVs	_ Can vary with "named" staff	call but usually 2-page max for each member.
JES-form		ative interface to the EPSRC:official s, objectives, public summary, suggested
Other supporting docs	Could be anyt	hing, e.g. letters of support.
