- George H. Heilmeier, President and CEO of Bellcore
  - What are you trying to do? Articulate your objectives using absolutely no jargon.
  - How is it done today, and what are the limits of current practice?
  - What's new in your approach and why do you think it will be successful?
  - Who cares? If you're successful, what difference will it make?
  - What are the risks and the payoffs?
  - How much will it cost? How long will it take?
  - What are the midterm and final "exams" to check for success?



# Background and Related Work

What is known to the community

What is not known to the community

Why what is not known to the community is actually worth knowing

Not a full survey – that's what ACM Comp Surveys are for.

Need to represent current knowledge, speculations and disagreements in the published literature and community.

Important to use this to identify the gaps – specifically the ones you want to fill with your proposal.



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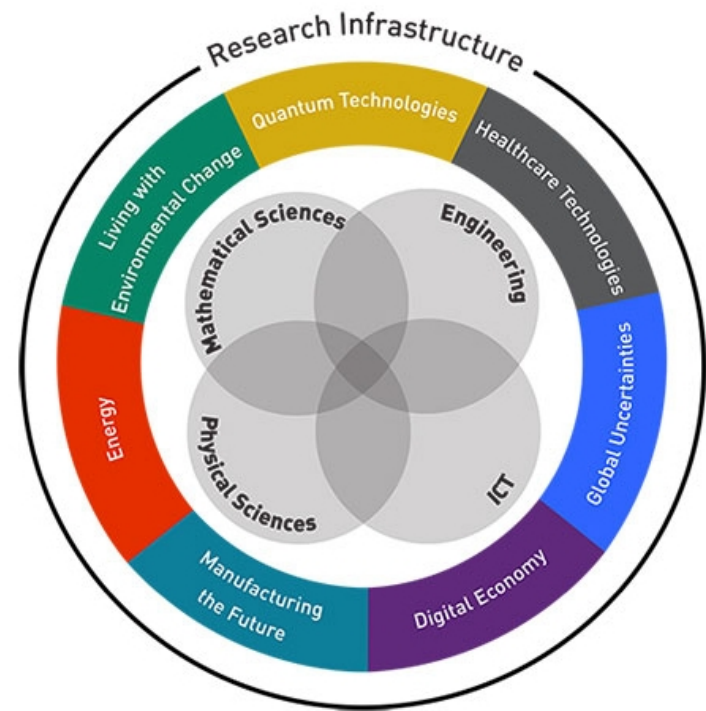
Include important work you are actually building on.

Critique fairly and with appropriate language.

Link also to your track record if you have been active in the area.



- If your proposal fits with identified funder priorities this is helpful and indeed essential for some calls.
- Within ICT the four priority challenge themes are:
  - Manufacturing the future:
  - Energy:
  - Digital economy:
  - Healthcare technologies





- Towards an Intelligent Information Infrastructure (TI3)
- Many-core architectures and concurrency in distributed and embedded systems (MACDES)
- Photonics (probably less relevant to most CS)
- New and emerging areas in ICT
- Working together (very important if you want a fellowship)
  
- Bit hard to argue that the *general area* isn't of importance if it directly concerns one of the challenge themes or strategic priorities.
- But you need to further argue that your specific proposal is of particular importance/relevance.

- Who outside your office actually cares and why? Provide evidence to back your claims up.
